College Profile

King Hintsa TVET College is a merger of former Centane Technical College, Teko Technical College, H.B. Tsengwa Technical College and Idutywa Satellite formerly known as Idutywa Community College. King Hintsa TVET College is situated in the South Eastern Region of the Eastern Cape. The Central Administration Office is at 218 Mthatha Road, Butterworth next to WSU (Butterworth campus).

The college is spread bewveen the Wvo Local Municipality with three campuses Centane, Msobomvu, Teko and Admin Centre situated in Mnquma Local Municipality. Dutywa and Willowvale Campuses are situated in Mbashe Local Municipality. College campuses are at a radius of + -60 KM apart.

King Hintsa TVET College is well known for educating adults, out of school youth and project linked trainees ranging from learners with a low academic background to those who have had opportunities to enhance their educational level.

King Hintsa TVET College is trying to address the socio-economic needs of the broader community, through innovation and delivery of responsive programmes.



WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN NCV AND REPORT 191 NATED?

NATIONAL CERTIFICATE VOCATIONAL NCV

- The NCV consists of three consecutive Qualifications on NQF Levels2,3 and 4.
- Each level is a full qualification and takes one academic year to complete when studying fulltime.
- Each NCV level is made up of 3
 fundamental subjects (a language, life
 orientation and mathematical literacy),
 3 compulsory vocational subjects in
 the particular field of study and one
 optional subject, which focuses on
 specialization in a pa Iticular
 occupation.
- Upon completion, a student may articulate to the Report 191 Programme.

REPORT 191 NATED

The NATED programmes refers to the report 191, N4 to N6, offering that were developed for what was previously known as technical colleges.

- A student who has achieved a N2 certificate in engineering studies, and who has proof of 2 years work experience the same field as the subjects on the N2 certificate, can apply to take trade test to qualify as an artisan.
- The only other qualification that is achieved through the report 191 system is the National N Diploma, which is currently issued by the DHET after successful completion of N6 plus 2 years work experience for Engineering Studies, in the same field as the subjects on the N6-certificate.
- Upon completion, a student may articulate to a university qualification such as an Advanced Diploma.

PROGRAMMES

OCCUPATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

Duration: Credit-bearing certificates that range from 1-4 years

Admission Requirements:

Entry Requirements vary depending on the qualification.

General:

All Occupational Qualifications are credit-bearing (1 credit = 10 learning hours). Hours must be accumulated over the prescribed duration of the training programme at the approved college and workplace. At the end of your programme, you'll complete the External Integrated Summative. Assessment (EISA). This national exam ensures every graduate meets the same quality and competency standards.

You can apply for NSFAS funding

NATIONAL CERTIFICATE VOCATIONAL (NCV)

Duration: Minimum duration is 3 years

Admission Requirements:

- A Grade 9 school report which indicates a pass Grade 9
- An Adult Education and Training (AET) NQF Level Certificate
- A recognised equivalent qualification obtained at NQF Level 1 which includes at least one language

For students to be issued with a NC(V), they must have complied with both the attendance and the internal assessment requirements for all the required subjects as well as the Integrated Summative Assessment Tasks (ISATs) for all the vocational subjects of the qualification.

REPORT 191 ENGINEERING

Duration: 11 weeks per N-level

Admission Requirements:

- An appropriate National Certificate N3 Engineering Studies; or
- A Senior Certificate, with at least three instructional offerings which are applicable to the instructional offerings chosen by the candidate for the programme; or An equivalent qualification
- Proceed to next level only when the previous level has been successfully completed i.e. N4 for N5, etc.

To qualify for a National Diploma, students need to obtain and complete 24 months relevant practical.

STUDENT SELECTION/ADMISSION GUIDELINES

1. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR REPORT 191 ENGINEERING N4 - N6

- 1.1 A student who has passed Grade 12 ADMISSION technical, N3 or NQF Level 4 vocational will be admitted to N4
- 1 .2 Any student with Grade 12 and has obtained 40% in Mathematics and Physical Science will be admitted to N4 for Civil Engineering
- 1 .3 For Electrical Engineering N4 a student must have passed grade 12 with 45% and more on Mathematics and Physical Science.

3. THE APPLICATION MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE FOLLOWING:

- 31. Required academic certificate
- 3.2 Certificate of conduct (if previously enrolled at another institution)
- 3.3 Academic Record (if previously enrolled at another FET institution).
- 3.4 All other formal qualifications attained.
- 3.5 Valid South African Identity Document.

2. STUDENT WHO DO NOT MEET THE MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

- 21. Students who do not meet the minimum criteria for admission as outlined above may be directed to Pre-Vocational Learning (PLP) which serves as a bridging course prior to enrolment onto NCV.
- 2.2 Students who are not admitted because of space will be referred to other Colleges.

4. LEARNERS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

The campus will under no circumstances discriminate any student, all students will be given equal opportunities on selection.

5. ADMISSION BY TRANSFER

- 5.1 Admission and enrolment by transfer from another institution shall be conditional upon the following:
- 5.1.1 A satisfactory academic record of work undertaken in that institution.
- 5.1.2 Certificate of good conduct acceptable of the institution
- 5.1.3 No outstanding debts at other institutions.
- 5.1.4 Approval by the Head of Department
- 5.1.5 Availability of space for these students at King Hintsa TVET College.

6. APPEALS PROCEDURE

Appeals concerning an individual admission decision may be heard only if it has been proved that the process was flawed. An appeal shall be lodged to the Campus Manager, who will look onto each case and give a feedback.
