COLLEGE PROFILE



King Hintsa TVET College is a merger of former Centane Technical College, Teko Technical College, H.B. Tsengwa Technical College and Idutywa Satellite formerly known as Idutywa Community College. King Hintsa TVET College is situated in the South Eastern Region of the Eastern Cape. The Central Administration Office is at 218 Mthatha Road, Butterworth next to WSU (Butterworth campus). The College is spread between the Two Local Municipalities with three campuses Centane, Msobomvu, Teko campuses and Admin Centre situated in Mnquma Local Municipality. Dutywa and Willowvale Campuses are situated in Mbashe Local Municipality. College campuses are at a radius of + -60 KM apart . King Hintsa TVET College is well known for educating adults, out of school youth and project linked trainees ranging from learners with a low academic background to those who have had opportunities to enhance their educational level. King Hintsa TVET College is trying to address the socio-economic needs of the broader community, through innovation and delivery of responsive programmes.

NATIONAL CERTIFICATE VOCATIONAL (NCV)

Duration: Minimum duration is 3 years

Admission Requirements:

- A Grade 9 school report which indicates a pass Grade 9
- An Adult Education and Training (AET) NQF Level Certificate
- A recognised equivalent qualification obtained at NQF Level 1 which includes at least one language

For students to be issued with a NC(V), they must have complied with both the attendance and the internal assessment requirements for all the required subjects as well as the Integrated Summative Assessment Tasks (ISATs) for all the vocational subjects of the qualification

OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAMMES

DURATION: The duration varies depending on the specific occupational qualification or programme and may range from approximately 1-4 years.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- A Grade 9, grade 12 or equivalent qualification, depending on the programme.
- Relevant prior learning, where applicable.
- Some programmes may require workplace placement or an employer agreement.

Learning components

Occupational qualifications are designed around three main components:

- Knowledge/Theory
- Practical skills
- Workplace Experience

STUDENT SELECTION/ADMISSION GUIDELINES

1. STUDENT WHO DO NOT MEET THE MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

- 1.1. Students who do not meet the minimum criteria for admission as outlined above may be directed to Pre-Vocational Learning (PLP) which serves as a bridging course prior to enrolment onto NCV.
- 2.2 Students who are not admitted because of space will be referred to other Colleges.

2. THE APPLICATION MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE FOLLOWING:

- 2.1. Required academic certificate
- 2.2 Certificate of conduct (if previously enrolled at another institution)
- 2.3 Academic Record (if previously enrolled at another FET institution).
- 2.4 All other formal qualifications attained.
- 2.5 Valid South African Identity Document.

3. LEARNERS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

The campus will under no circumstances discriminate any student, and all students will be given equal opportunities on selection

4. ADMISSION BY TRANSFER

- 4.1 Admission and enrolment by transfer from another institution shall be conditional upon the following:
 - 4.1.1 A satisfactory academic record of work undertaken in that institution.
 - 4.1.2 Certificate of good conduct acceptable of the institution
 - 4.1.3 No outstanding debts at other institutions.
 - 4.1.4 Approval by the Head of Department
 - 4.1.5 Availability of space for these students at King Hintsa TVET College

APPEAL PROCEDURE

Appeals concerning an individual admission decision may be heard only if it has been proved that the process was flawed. An appeal shall be lodged to the Campus Manager, who will look onto each case and give a feedback.

• The NCV consists of three consecutive Qualifications on NQF Levels 2, 3, and 4. • Each level is a full qualification and takes one academic year to complete when studying fulltime. • Each NCV level is made up of 3 fundamental subjects (a language, life orientation and mathematical literacy), 3 compulsory vocational subjects in the particular field of study and one optional subject, which focuses on specialization in a particular occupation. • Upon completion, a student may articulate to the Report 191 Programme	• Focuses mainly on occupation-specific knowledge, practical skills and workplace competence. • Strong emphasis on hands-on practical training and workplace exposure. • Primarily repares learners for employment and competence in a specific occupation. • Develops specific skills and competencies required for a particular occupation.

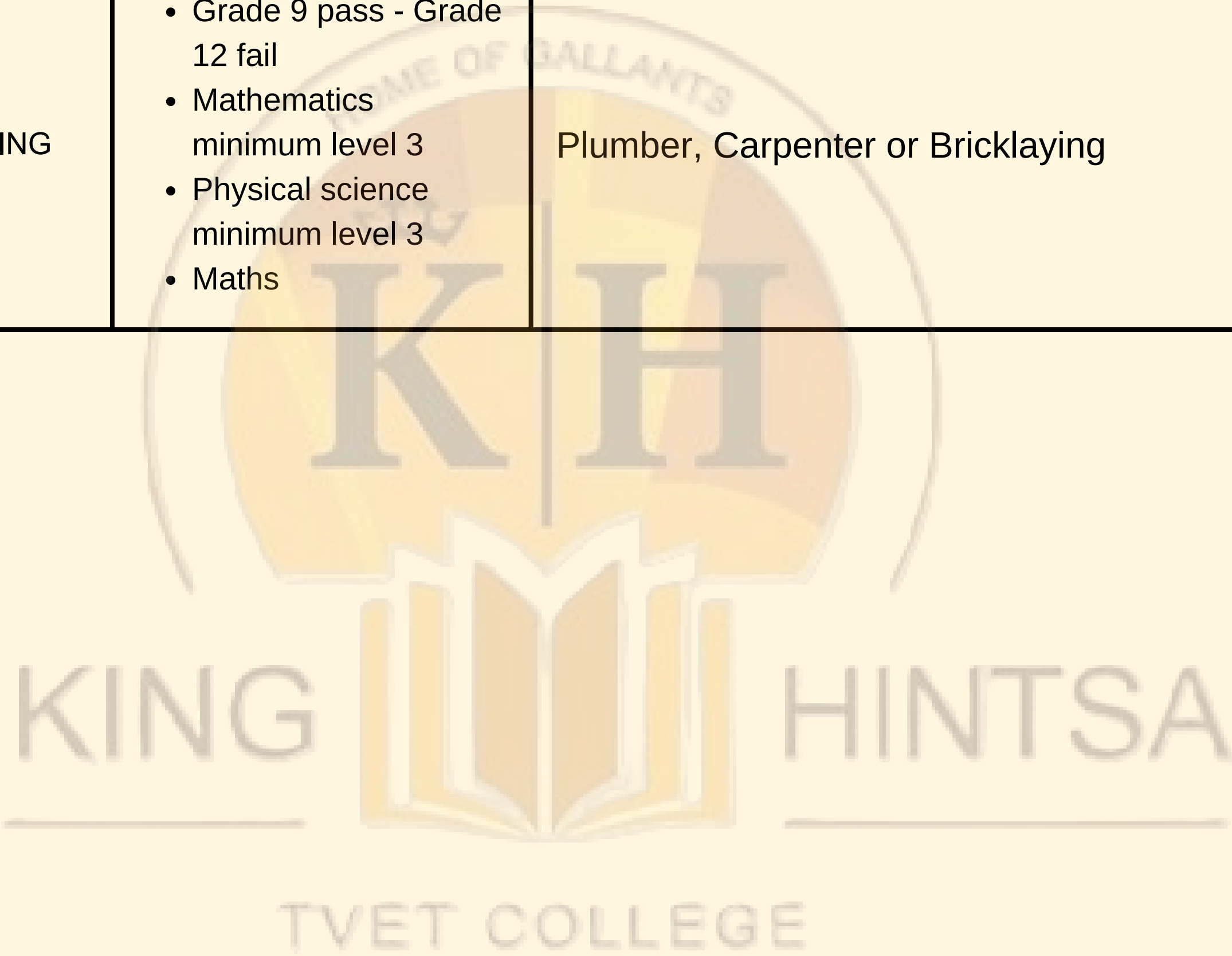
